EAR INFECTION

Your child has a bacterial infection in his/her ear(s). The infection may be causing ear pain and fever.

The doctor has prescribed an antibiotic for the infection. Sometimes, it may take a few days for the antibiotic to work, so the fever may continue for 2-3 more days. It is important that you continue to give your child the antibiotic as prescribed.

You can lower the fever and ease the pain by giving:

1. α TYLENOL EVERY 4 HOURS OR α MOTRIN _____ EVERY 6 HOURS 2. Another way to control pain is by using ear drops that numb the ear drum and provide additional comfort to the child. The ear drops (approximately 2-3 drops) can be used every 2-3 hours as needed. 3. But most important is the: ANTIBIOTIC: DOSE: _____ EVERY ____ HOURS This will cure the ear infection. However, if the fever continues or the pain worsens, for more than 2-3 days or if your child's condition is worsening, bring him/her back to the office.
