## **SCARLET FEVER**

Scarlet fever is caused by a bacteria called "Strep."

## **SYMPTOMS:**

- A fine, red rash that feels like sandpaper (usually all over the entire body).
- Sore throat
- Fever (fever may persist for 2-3 days)
- Vomiting
- Abdominal pains
- Headache
- Strawberry colored tongue
- Skin may peel for several weeks after the rash is gone; this is also normal.
