If your child continues to have discomfort or fever after 2 full days on the medication, bring him/her back to the doctor's office.

\*\*\*NOTE: Because urinary tract infections commonly come back within 1-2 months, it is important that your child is seen by the doctor during that time.

\*\*\*NOTE: Children under the age of 5 may require a further work-up including a renal ultrasound and other diagnostic procedures to evaluate the potential cause of the urinary tract infection.
